- Recognise that learning can be a struggle
- Keep going despite difficulties and find ways to overcome them

ACTIVITIES TO BUILD THEIR PERSEVERANCE MUSCLE AT HOME:

- Talk about learning they find challenging at school
- Give your kids time to think through a problem – don't save them!
- Encourage them to share their feelings when they are stuck

DURING THE ACTIVITIES REMEMBER TO:

- Praise each other's good ideas and efforts
- Allow them to experiment with ideas
- Stand back and let them learn

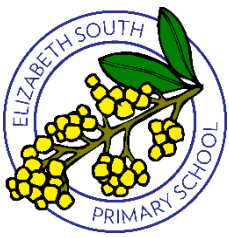
