- Have discussions about what they can learn from their mistakes

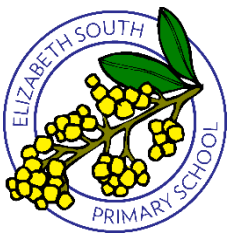
DURING THE ACTIVITIES REMEMBER:
