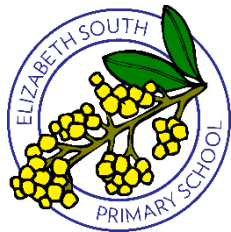

At Elizabeth South students are loving the opportunity to participate in guitar ensembles and percussion groups with high quality tuition.

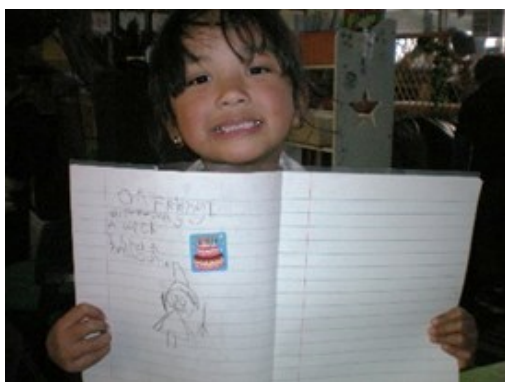
INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM
